## KOREAN EXPERIENCE DISPLAY

Carlos Ballard displayed a very interesting set of photos and artifacts pertaining to his tour in Korea in the Marine Corps during 1952 and 1953. He was then assigned to Marine Air Group 12 operating out of airbase K-6 south of Seoul. In addition to his photos and artifacts he had models of 2 tactical aircraft which his unit used. They were the F4U Corsair and the AD Skyraider, both used as ground support aircraft. The Corsair also saw service as a fighter aircraft in the hands of Navy Lt. Guy Bordelon who became the first Navy Ace of the Korean War when he shot down 5 North Korean Bed Check Charlie prop-driven aircraft in night actions near Seoul and Inchon during the summer of 1952. Bordelon’s success was due to his flying skill and also to the fact that his aircraft was one of the first to carry a radar pod on one wing. Carlos had pictures of Bordelon’s plane and of Bordelon receiving the Silver Star for his accomplishments. Other photos pictured Carlos on duty with his unit, and of some Marine aircraft that had crashed on landing. As a backdrop for his display he had a beautiful collection of Marine Corps Air shoulder patches which most of us had never seen before.

Thanks Carlos for sharing this with us. You were really young and good looking back then.

## KOREAN WAR VETERAN SEVERELY BEATEN



Our good friend and fellow veteran, was severely beaten by an intruder in his home. On Monday, May 16, 2011, Tom Mixon returned home in the late morning to find an intruder in his home. The man severely beat Tom about the head with Tom's own gun, even beating him as he lay on the floor, then ransacked his home, stealing several guns and Tom's white pickup truck. Tom's wife, Barbara, found him in a pool of blood and called for help. He was transported to Memorial Hermann Hospital in the Medical Center, where he was admitted to the Trauma Unit.

Good News: His daughter Melody, reported that he was released to go home from the hospital Wednesday, May 25. He is going to receive home health care, which is better than a rehab recovery facility. (Not sure he would stay in a nursing home or rehab facility) The stitches that needed to be removed were done so before he left the hospital, there are still internal stitches in his mouth, where they did reconstructive surgery, using metal plates to secure the facial bones. He has a patch on his right eye, as it was severely damaged. He is using a walker for now, but I'm sure he will toss it as soon as possible, he is also on a soft, baby food type, diet. His wife, Barbara, credits his fast recovery, to the fact that he was in excellent physical condition, plus he's a stubborn Marine. He still has a long way to go.

He still carries the signs of his sever beating in the form of scars, numerous bruises, missing teeth and using the walker for support. **MIRACLES STILL HAPPEN, and ANGLES ARE ALL AROUND.**

## ATTENTION - MILITARY CERTIFICATES

All American Korean War Veterans are eligible and will be presented, or mailed, a signed certificate from the United States of America, Department of Defense Secretary, Robert Gates. This certificate congratulates and thanks the veterans for their service during the Korean War. This means that all USA Military Persons that served from 25 June 1950 to 1 January 1955 in Korea, or the surrounding Korean Sea and all USA Military Service Bases during that time.

Each Certificate will have the veterans name and Branch of Service.
