UPDATE ON OUR FRIEND - HUEY LONG

Our friend, Huey Long, the last of the famed 'Ink Spots' singing group, had a run of bad luck recently. A woman named Nancy Tankleson of Bellaire, Tx., who makes documentary films, approached him about making a documentary on his career. He loaned her "Big D", his beloved 60 year old guitar and other memorabilia, but when he wanted these items back, he says she refused to return them. He filed a lawsuit in Federal Court to regain the items, plus have her pay his attorney fees. The judge granted a temporary restraining order to prevent her from selling the items. As a result, his daughter said he was deeply depressed. He had also given her power of attorney (since cancelled) plus \$2,000. in cash and \$10,000 to create a book on his life called "**The Huey Long Story**". 1,000 copies were printed, and he got 500 copies and she has the balance. Apparently, she completed 2/3 of the documentary, but she wanted him to travel to various clubs and other venues where he performed, including out of state. Beginning in 2007, he was unable to do so because of mild strokes and congestive heart failure problems. She threatened to sue him if he didn't make the trips and kept his items for security. To add to his problems, on February 29th, he fell and fractured a hip bone and was hospitalized at St. Joseph Medical Center.

The good news is that in court, on March 7th, Judge Ken Wise ordered her to immediately return all his items, plus the \$2,000 in cash. Huey's lawyer took "Big D", and brought it to him at the hospital. Channel 11 showed him walking in with "Big D" and Huey's face just lit up in joy. Let's all wish him a speedy recovery and rejoice with him on the return of his old friend "Big D". All's well that ends well. Get well fast, old friend!

Let's not forget, Mr. Huey Long will be 104 years old this month.
